## A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE~~R~~ FOR THE CONSIDERATION OF THE HOUSE ADMINISTRATION AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

**SEC 1.** That upon the adoption of this Resolution, it shall be in order to consider in the House the Resolution (H. Res. 4) to separate the House property line between the House of Commons (4848) and 4756 N. Range Road and for other purposes. All points of order against consideration of the resolution are waived. The Resolution shall be considered as read and all points of order against provisions in the resolution are waived. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the resolution, and on any further amendment thereto, to final passage without intervening motion except (1) one hour of debate equally divided and controlled by the Chair and Ranking Member on the Committee on Natural Resources or their respective designees; and (2) one motion to recommit.

**SEC 2. MULTIPLE MEASURES.**

question on any such motion without debate or intervening motion.

(b) A measure referred to subsection (a) includes any measure that was the object of a motion to suspend the rules on which the yeas and nays are ordered and further proceedings postponed.

(c) Upon offering of a motion pursuant to subsection (a) concerning multiple measures, the ordering of the yeas and nays on postponed motions to suspend the rules with respect to such measures is vacated to end that all such motions are considered as withdrawn.

### **SEC 3. VOTING RULES.**

(a) A recorded vote must occur if suspending the rules and  $\frac{3}{4}$  must agree on suspension of the rules and passage.

(b) 3 out of 4 members are needed in order to advance a motion or suspend the rules

(c) If there is a tie (2-2), the motion is not agreed to under Section 3(b) under this Resolution.

(d) A voice vote is taken first, unless suspending the rules (Section 3(a)), and the Chair declares the Opinion of the Chair.

(e) Any member may request the YEAS and NAYS after the Opinion of the Chair on which members

## **SEC 4. CHAIR AUTHORITIES.**

On any legislative day from July 1<sup>st</sup> through July 31<sup>st</sup>—

- (a) The Chair may declare the House adjourned
- (b) The Chair may declare the House in recess
- (c) The Speaker may appoint members to perform the duties of the Chair
- (d) The Speaker shall have the authority to bring the House into session at any given time when a quorum is present under an emergency situation

## **SEC 5. SPEECHES.**

- (a) A member may speak out of order if there is no objection
- (b) A member may speak for a maximum of ten (10) minutes unless extended without objection under general speeches
- (c) Explicit language as deemed by the Chair shall not be permitted

## **SEC 6. COMMITTEE TIE VOTES.**

- (a) If a Committee of the House records a tie vote—

- (1) The Clerk of the House shall be informed



(b) If the Motion in Section 6(a)(2) passed with a tie or greater, the motion is placed on the calendar

(c) Failure to reach a tie or greater on the motion described in Section 6(a)(2), the motion is not agreed to

## **SEC 7. VETO POWERS.**

(a) The Speaker of the House of Commons shall have the power to veto any Resolution or bill that passes before the House

(b) The Speaker must provide a reason for the veto.

## **SEC 8. VETO OVERRIDE PROCESS.**

(a) Any member may make a motion to override the veto before the session sine die.

(b) There is no debate and a vote is taken right away under Section 3 rules.
