JANUARY 30TH - THE GENTLEWOMAN, SARAH CAVINDER, SUBMITS THE FOLLOWING JOINT RESOLUTION FOR CONSIDERATION; WHICH WAS HELD AT THE SPEAKER'S DESK.

A JOINT RESOLUTION TO

Repeal all House Code relating to Jazz Jennings, banning of merchandise relating to Jazz, banning the show *I am Jazz*, and to recognize the fallacies in Jazz's logic and showing support for allowing children to explore themselves.

BE IT ENACTED *by this House of Commons with the advice and consent of the same, as follows:*

1 **SECTION 1. Title.**

2 This Act shall be cited as the “Ban Jazz Act.”

3 **SECTION 2. Steps.**

4 (a) The House will remove House Code relating to Jazz
5 Jennings.

6 (b) The House will ban any merchandise relating to Jazz
7 Jennings.

8 (c) The House will ban the show “*I am Jazz.*”

9 **SECTION 3. Findings.**

10 (a) The House will recognize that Jazz’s mother,
11 Jeannette, forced her to be transgender in order to get
12 famous.

13 (b) The House will recognize that Jazz is not a
14 trustworthy source about transgenderism and gender
15 dysphoria as, according to Michael K. Laidlaw in the
16 article “Gender Dysphoria and Children: An
17 Endocrinologist’s Evaluation of I am Jazz,” “The book *I*
18 *am Jazz*, by Jazz Jennings and Jessica Herthel, contains
19 a number of factual inaccuracies and very significant
20 omissions. I am very concerned that children or even
21 adults that read theses books will be given false ideas
22 about transgenderism. This will lead to the harm of
23 children, as has already happened at Rocklin Academy.”

24 (c) The House will recognize that children should be
25 allowed to explore themselves naturally without being
26 forced into an identity.
