A RESOLUTION TO

Provide for consideration of H. Res. 10, expressing the
need for proper oral care, HR 3, the Tax Exemptions and
Deductions Act, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED *by this House of Commons with the advice and consent of the same, as follows:*

1 *Resolved*, that upon the adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the resolution
3 (H. Res. 10) expressing the need for proper oral care. All
4 points of order against consideration of the resolution are
5 waived. All points against provisions in the resolution are
6 waived. The previous question shall be considered as
7 ordered on the resolution and preamble to adoption
8 without intervening motion except one hour of debate and
9 one motion to recommit.

10 *Resolved*, that at any time after adoption of this
11 resolution the Speaker may declare the House resolved
12 into the Committee of the Whole House for consideration
13 of the bill (HR 3), Tax Exemptions and Deductions Act.
14 The first reading of the bill shall be dispensed with. All
15 points of order against consideration of the bill are
16 waived. General debate shall be confined to the bill and
17 shall not exceed one hour of debate. After general debate,
18 the bill shall be considered for amendment under the five-
19 minute rule. Amendments shall be in writing when being
20 called up by Members. When the committee rises and
21 reports the bill back to the House with a recommendation
22 that the bill do pass, the previous question shall be
23 considered as ordered on the bill and amendments thereto
24 to final passage without intervening motion except one
25 motion to recommit.

26 *Resolved*, that the Chair be permitted to declare the
27 House adjourned through February 28, 2023.
