## A BILL TO

Require the installation of fire and carbon monoxide alarms, requires interoperability of alarms, monthly testing for alarms, providing a reasonable standard of room clearance, installation of fire extinguishers, and testing and reporting of fire extinguishers.

**B** IT ENACTED by this House of Commons with the advice and consent of the same, as follows:

### 1 SECTION 1. Title.

- 2 This Act shall be cited as the "Fire and Carbon Monoxide
- 3 Safety Act."
- 4 SECTION 2. Installation of alarms.
- 5 (a) REQUIREMENTS.—Their shall be at least one (1)
- 6 alarm on each floor of the House that shall detect the
- 7 presence of fire and carbon monoxide.
- 8 (b) INTEROPERABILITY.—When one alarm goes off, all
- 9 alarms in the House must go off.
- 10 SECTION 3. Testing.
- 11 (a) CERTIFICATION OF WORKING ORDER.—Each
- month, the Sergeant-at-Arms shall be required to test
- each alarm to ensure that it is in working order.
- 14 (b) The requirement as described in subsection (a) shall be
- documented in a communication to the House that shall
- 16 identify:
- 17 (1) the date the alarms where tested;
- 18 (2) number of alarms that were in order; and
- 19 (3) if any, number of alarms that were not working.
- 20 (c) Failure to test the alarms in the required timeframe
- 21 shall have committed a Class A Misdemeanor.
- 22 SECTION 4. Enactment dates.

- shall test all alarms that currently exist within five (5)
- 25 days from the date of enactment and shall report these
- results in accordance with § 3(b) of this Act.
- 27 (b) OTHER REQUIREMENTS.—All other requirements
- shall take effect by July 1, 2023.
- 29 **SECTION 5. Room clearance.**
- 30 (a) All rooms, hallways, stairways, and pathways to an
- 31 exit on the Property of the House, including the Garage,
- 32 must be reasonably clear at all times.
- 33 (b) Any person who fails to ensure a reasonable standard
- as described in subsection (a) shall have committed a
- 35 Class B Misdemeanor.
- 36 (c) The Sergeant-at-Arms shall enforce all common areas.
- 37 SECTION 6. Installation of fire extinguishers.
- 38 (a) REQUIREMENT.—There shall be on each level of the
- 39 House at least one (1) fire extinguisher.
- 40 (b) IDENTIFICATION.—There shall be signage to be able
- 41 to reasonably identify where the fire extinguisher is
- 42 located on each floor.
- 43 **SECTION 7. Testing and reporting fire**
- 44 extinguishers.
- 45 (a) TESTING.—The Sergeant-at-Arms shall verify each
- 46 month that each fire extinguisher is in working order.
- 47 (b) REPORTING.—The Sergeant-at-Arms, after testing
- and replacing, if applicable, each fire extinguisher, shall
- 49 report to the House:
- 50 (1) the date the fire extinguishers where tested;
- 51 (2) number of fire extinguishers that were in order;
- 52 and
- 53 (3) if any, number of fire extinguishers that were
- 54 not working.
