Set internet privacy rights and standards.

B **E IT ENACTED** *by this House of Commons with the advice and consent of the same, as follows:*

1 **SECTION 1. Title.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Internet Privacy Rights
3 Act.”

4 **SECTION 2. Monitoring.**

5 Any Member who has an electronic device that:

- 6 (1) is connected to the Network of the House; or
- 7 (2) is purchased under funds by the House;

8 shall be subject to monitoring for the purposes of ensuring
9 compliance with HCC § 6-1-3(d).

10 **SECTION 3. Guest network.**

11 Any persons connected to the Guest Network of the House
12 shall have an understanding that:

13 (1) any activity conducted under the network is
14 subject to monitoring;

15 (2) attempting to circumvent any blocked website
16 under HCC § 6-1-2(a) is unlawful pursuant to HCC
17 § 6-1-3(d); and

18 (3) conducting any illegal activities under the
19 Network is unlawful under § 4 of this Act.

20 **SECTION 4. Illegal internet activities.**

21 Any person who attempts or is successful in conducting an
22 illegal activity over the Network of the House shall have
23 committed a Class B Felony, notwithstanding HCC § 6-1-
24 3(d).

25 **SECTION 5. Definitions.**

26 (a) “*Illegal activity.*”—any attempt or action done that is
27 in violation of a federal, state, local, HCC, or HAC statute.

28 (b) “*Network.*”—internet connection or data service that is
29 provided by the House.
