The Committee on Vacation, having considered this Report, report favorably thereon and recommends that the Report be approved.

The form of the Resolution that the Committee on Vacation would recommend to the House of Commons for Vacation to Columbus, Ohio and for other purposes pursuant to this Report is as follows:

Resolved, that the House of Commons shall go to Columbus, Ohio on April 7 to April 9 for vacation purposes.

Resolved, that all expenses shall be expensed by the Treasurer of the House.

Resolved, that all declarations set to expire within April 7th to April 9th shall remain in force until April 10th, unless renewed again.

Resolved, that everyone must be happy during the trip and acting mature for their age.

Resolved, that no one be forced to swim in the pool.

PURPOSE AND SUMMARY
