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***Joint* RESOLUTION**

to

add a Rule to the 2022 Rules of the House for the process
of nominations to the House and the respective
confirmation process.

TABLE OF PROVISIONS.

BE IT ENACTED by this House of Commons, in this present, assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 *Resolved*, that the following Rule be added to the Rules
2 of the House of Commons:

3 **“Rule XIX. Nominations and Confirmation.**

4 “(a) The following positions are considered as nominations
5 under this Rule:

6 “(1) Chair and Ranking Member Committee
7 Assignments;

8 “(2) Health Advisor of the House;

9 “(3) All Agencies Positions created under law; and

10 “(4) any additional position that the House may add
11 under law.

12 “(b) The House does not treat the Clerk, Speaker,
13 Sergeant-at-Arms, and Chief Administrative Officer as
14 nominated positions under this Rule.

15 “(c) The Speaker shall have the sole power to nominate
16 someone to the House upon a creation or vacancy of such
17 position. Such nominations shall be in writing, read as a
18 communication to the House, and, unless otherwise,
19 referred and placed the House Calendar.

20 “(d) Unless otherwise stated in an Act, nominated
21 positions are placed on the House Calendar until they are
22 called up by the Speaker.

23 “(e) Upon the Speaker calling up a nomination on the
24 House Calendar, the Clerk shall report the nomination
25 and proceed immediately to the vote on confirmation of
26 the nomination.

27 “(f) Upon confirmation of a nominee, the Speaker shall be
28 immediately notified of the House’s actions. If a nominee

29 is not confirmed, the Speaker shall nominate someone
30 else.

31 “(g) The Speaker may withdraw a nomination anytime
32 before the question is put thereon.

33 “(h) Unless otherwise stated in an Act, nominated
34 positions are confined to Members of the House.

35 “(i) The Speaker may remove any person from their
36 respective nominated position if so warranted. The House
37 may pass a Joint Resolution to find disapproval of a
38 person in a nominated position. If such measure passes
39 and is Assented, that shall be considered removed from
40 such position.

41 “(j) The House may from time to time pass Acts to impose
42 term limits on nominations, creations of new nominated
43 positions, and amending this Rule.”
