BILL

to set safety standards, permitted websites, and other authorities to ensure safety on the Internet.

B IT ENACTED by this House of Commons, in this present, assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECTION 1. Title.

2 (a) This Act may be cited as "The Internet Safety Act of3 2022."

4 **SECTION 2. Management.**

5 (a) The Speaker shall manage all aspects and enforcement6 of this Act.

7 SECTION 3. Safety standards.

- 8 (a) The Speaker shall have the authority to block websites
- 9 as described in § 4(a) if they meet one of the following
- 10 requirements:
- 11 (i) Causes damage to device;
- 12 (ii) Promotes illegal activities and/or violence;
- 13 (iii) Causes potential health issues (e.g. seizures);
- 14 Or
- 15 (iv) In some capacity is a threat to the House.
- 16 (b) The following are excluded from § 3(a), excluding
- 17 §3(a)(v):
- 18 (i) Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, and Snapchat;
- 19 and
- 20 (ii) Pornography

21 SECTION 4. Websites.

- 22 (a) The Speaker shall determine if a website is considered
- unsafe under the Standards set in § 3 and is permitted to
- block such website on the Network of the House.

- (b) When such website is blocked, it must be
- communicated in such a manner that the House Assembly
- is aware of the blocked website.
- 28 (c) Phishing websites known are already blocked
- automatically in the Network of the House. This shall
- 30 serve as a protection to the Network.

31 SECTION 5. Checks.

- 32 (a) The House shall serve as a "check", and can do the33 following:
- 34 (i) Block a website; or
- 35 (ii) Unblock a website.
- (b) § 5(a) shall be served as a Resolution and must be
- voted on with a majority vote and is subject to Veto
- 38 powers as granted.
- (c) If a website is voted unblocked by the House, it mustbe unblocked within 15 days of Assent.
- 41 (i) A website can be re-blocked if deemed it falls
- 42 into a different standards as set out in § 3 of this
- 43 Act.
- 44 (d) If a website is voted blocked by the House, it must be
- 45 blocked within 15 days of Assent.
