E IT ENACTED by this House of Commons, in this present, assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECTION 1. Title.

- 2 (a) This Act shall be cited as "Further House
- 3 Administrations Act".
- 4 SECTION 2. Invalid statutes.
- 5 (a) Notwithstanding the inclusion in the House Code of
- 6 statutory provisions declared impliedly repealed,
- 7 unconstitutional, or otherwise, those provisions have only
- 8 such force as they had before the enactment of House
- 9 Code.

10 SECTION 3. Effective dates.

- 11 (a) Each provision of each Act passed at a session of the
- 12 assembly takes effect immediately upon the signature of
- the Speaker, unless a different time is specified in the
- 14 Act.
- (i) Subsection (a) does not apply to Acts that are vetoed by the Speaker.
- 17 (b) If the House passes over the Speaker's veto, each
- provision of each Act shall take effect immediately upon
- 19 its passage.
- 20 SECTION 4. Revival, release, or extinguishment.

21 (a) Whenever a statute is repealed which repealed a former statute, the former statute shall not thereby be 22 revived unless it shall be so expressly provided. The 23 repeal of any statute shall not have the effect to release or 24 extinguish any penalty, forfeiture, or liability incurred 25 under such statute, unless the repealing statute shall so 26 27 expressly provide; and such statute shall be treated as still remaining in force for the purposes of sustaining any 28 proper action or prosecution for the enforcement of such 29 penalty, forfeiture, or liability. 30 **SECTION 5. Hierarchy of law.** 31 32 (a) The House of Commons laws governing itself is 33 declared to be: (i) The Constitution of the United States; 34 35 (ii) The Laws of the State of Indiana; (iii) The Laws of the United States of America; and 36 (iv) The Laws of the House of Commons. 37 38 **SECTION 6. Right to amend or repeal law.** 39 (a) Each law of the House is enacted subject to the right of the assembly to amend or repeal that law at any time. 40 41 **SECTION 7. Standard time.** (a) The House shall follow the time as designated by the 42 43 location of the House in which the County the House resides in. 44 45 **SECTION 8. Legal holidays.** 46 (a) The following are legal holidays in the House of Commons for all purposes: 47 (i) New Year's Day, January 1; 48 (ii) Martin Luther King Jr.'s Day, the third Monday 49 in January; 50 (iii) Abraham Lincoln's Birthday, February 12; 51

(iv) George Washington's Birthday, the third

Monday in February;

54	(v) Good Friday, a movable feast day;
55	(vi) Memorial Day, the last Monday in May;
56	(vii) Independence Day, July 4;
57	(viii) Labor Day, the first Monday in September;
58	(ix) Election Day, the day of election;
59	(x) Veterans Day, November 11;
60 61	(xi) Thanksgiving Day, the fourth Thursday in November; and
62	(xii) Christmas Day, December 25.
63 64 65	(b) This section does not affect any action taken by the Speaker, the Assembly while in session, or any agency. Any action taken by these shall be valid for all purposes.
66	SECTION 9. Members.
67 68	(a) The House shall be composed of Members who reside in the House for living purposes.
69 70	(b) The House may not enter anyone into the House who does not reside.
71 72	(c) Members shall only represent themselves in all matters pertaining to the House.
73	SECTION 10. First meeting of the Assembly.
74 75	(a) The first assembly each year shall convene on the first Sunday in January at noon to do the following:
76	(i) Organize itself;
77	(ii) Elect the Speaker and respective officers; and
78	(iii) Take the Oath of Office.
79	SECTION 11. Establishment of rules.
80 81 82	(a) The House shall establish rules for its proceedings that are consistent with the House Code and does not violate any Laws on the federal, state, or local level.

SECTION 12. Filing of bills and resolutions.

- 84 (a) Bills and resolutions may be filed and assigned to
- committees at anytime after the convening of a session in
- 86 accordance with the Rules of the House.
- 87 **SECTION 13. Preparation of calendar.**
- 88 (a) The Speaker shall prepare a calendar in accordance
- with the Rules of the House.
