E IT ENACTED by this House of Commons, in this present, assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1	SECTION 1. Title.
2	This Act shall be cited as "Sick Reporting and Fine Act".
3	SECTION 2. Reporting illness.
4	(a) Individuals who are sick are hereby required to report
5	to the Clerk of the House such illness.
6	(i) The Clerk shall inform the Health Advisor of the
7	House within 12 hours from the Clerk's knowledge
8	of the Report.
9	(b) The Clerk shall implement a way to have individuals
10	report their illness.
11	(c) The Health Advisor has sole authority to require
12	certain actions within reason when an individual is III.
13	(i) The House may extend these actions during a
14	Health Emergency.
15	SECTION 3. Decelerating no illness.
16	(a) An individual must inform the Clerk and the Health
17	Advisor when they are no longer sick.
18	(b) The Health Advisor reserves the right to deny the
19	claim of no illness if there is reason to believe the
20	individual is still ill.
21	(c) Committing perjury under this Section is a Class B
22	Misdemeanor.
23	SECTION 4. Failure to report or intention.

24	(a) It shall be unlawful for an individual to fail to report
25	as described in Section 2.
26	(i) This shall be a Class C Misdemeanor.
-	(b) It shall be unlawful for an individual to intentionally
28	get another person ill.
29	(i) This shall be a Class C Misdemeanor.
