BE IT ENACTED by this House of Commons, in this present, assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

SECTION 1. Title.

This Act shall be cited as “Criminal Code Act”.

SECTION 2. Enforcement.

(a) The Speaker of the House in coordination with the Sergeant-at-Arms is responsible for enforcement of all House Code.

(b) The Sergeant-at-Arms is permitted to involve local law enforcement to enforce House Code when necessary.

(c) Failure of the Sergeant-at-Arms to enforce this Act is subject to censure and removal from the position.

(d) The Sergeant-at-Arms, in coordination with the Clerk of the House, shall implement a system to issue and track fines and points.

SECTION 3. Appealing.

(a) Anyone may appeal a fine and points duly issued to them within ten (10) days after receiving a notice in writing.

(b) The appellant shall provide evidence and documentation to the Sergeant-at-Arms within thirty (30) days after the appeal notice is issued.

(c) The Sergeant-at-Arms shall make a final decision within ten (10) days after all documentation is submitted

24 **SECTION 4. Issuance.**

25 (a) The Sergeant-at-Arms is permitted to take all actions
26 legal with respect to state, federal, local, and House of
27 Commons Code to collect fines issued to such peoples.

28 (b) All fines collected by the Sergeant-at-Arms shall be
29 handed over to the Treasurer of the House that shall be
30 added to the expenditure account of the House.

31 (c) Statues of Limitations – The Speaker nor Sergeant-at-
32 Arms shall not request payment of fines if one of the
33 following is met by such persons, and the person is not
34 subject to pay the fines:

35 (i) Fine is not collected within 365 days from the
36 date of issuance; or

37 (ii) Fine is forgiven by the Speaker of the House
38 through a deceleration; or

39 (iii) The House Assembly passes a Resolution for
40 the forgiveness of such fines.

41 **SECTION 5. Point system.**

42 (a) The House shall establish a point system for all
43 misdemeanors and felonies issued. These points shall
44 serve as the removal of certain privileges for a given time
45 period.

46 (i) The Clerk shall implement a system to manage
47 the point system.

48 (b) Points shall expire one year after their issuance.

49 (c) The Sergeant-at-Arms shall be delegated with the
50 implementation and enforcement of the point system,
51 including the special removal of privileges and the time
52 period for such removals.

53 (d) The Sergeant-at-Arms must give at least 15 days'
54 notice of any changes or additions to the point system.

55 (i) The Clerk shall make the point system easily
56 accessible to individuals.

57 **SECTION 6. Infraction.**

58 Members may receive an infraction that shall not be
59 subject to more than \$20.

60 **SECTION 7. Misdemeanors.**

61 (a) Misdemeanors shall be classified as lower, less serious
62 crimes and can be issued in the following classes:

63 (i) Class C - shall not be subject to more than \$50
64 and not more than 2 points;

65 (ii) Class B - shall not be subject to more than \$150
66 and not more than 4 points; and

67 (iii) Class A - shall not be subject to more than \$200
68 and not more than 5 points.

69 **SECTION 8. Felonies.**

70 (a) Felonies shall be classified as higher, more serious
71 crimes and can be issued in the following classes:

72 (i) Class D - shall not be subject to more than \$100
73 and not more than 3 points;

74 (ii) Class C - shall not be subject to more than \$200
75 and not more than 5 points;

76 (iii) Class B - shall not be subject to more than \$500
77 and not more than 7 points; and

78 (iv) Class A - shall not be subject to more than
79 \$1,000 and not more than 8 points.
