E IT ENACTED by this House of Commons, in this present, assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 SECTION 1. Title.

- 2 This Act shall be cited as the "Appealing Fines Reform
- 3 Act (AFRA)".
- 4 SECTION 2. Amendment.
- 5 Strike all following HCC 2-1-5(a) and insert:
- 6 "(b) Upon providing the notice of appeal as described in
- 7 subsection (a), the Petitioner may have up to and no more
- 8 than thirty (30) days to submit evidence and any other
- 9 appropriate documentation to support his or her appeal.
- 10 (i) The Sergeant-at-Arms shall ask the Petitioner if
- they have documentation to submit under this
- subsection the same day the notice of appealing is
- received by the Sergeant-at-Arms or may ask this
- question in the notice of appealing fine.
- (ii) It shall be unlawful for the Petitioner to
- purposefully provide false information in order to
- 17 extend the amount of time before a decision is
- 18 made.
- 19 (c) The Sergeant-at-Arms shall make a decision within
- 20 ten (10) days after (whichever comes first):
- 21 (i) all documentation is submitted as described in
- subsection (b) and there is no additional
- 23 documentation to submit;
- 24 (ii) the Petitioner confirms that there is no
- documentation to submit; or

26 27	(iii) the Petitioner runs out of the time granted to submit documentation.
28 29	(d) In the Sergeant-at-Arms final decision, the Sergeant-at-Arms shall provide his or her reasoning.
30 31 32 33 34	(e) CONFLICT OF INTREST.—Should the Sergeant-at-Arms have issued the original ticket or have another bias that would interfere in making a final decision, he or she shall pass these duties and requirements under this section to the Speaker of the House.
35 36	(f) DEFENITIONS.—"Petitioner" shall be defined in this section as the person seeking to appeal their fine."
