TABLE OF PROVISIONS.

SECTION 1.	TITLE.
SECTION 2.	CREATION OF OFFICE.

BE IT ENACTED by this House of Commons, in this present, assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1 **SECTION 1. Title.**

2 This Act may be cited as “The Office of Inspector General
3 Act”.

4 **SECTION 2. Creation of Office.**

5 There is hereby established an Agency of the House to be
6 known as “The Office of the Inspector General”
7 (hereinafter referred to in this Act as the “Office”).

8 **SECTION 3. Creation of Inspector General.**

9 There shall be at the head of the Office an Inspector
10 General who shall be appointed by the Speaker, with the
11 consent of the House.

12 **SECTION 4. Duties.**

13 (a) As provided in HCC § 10-3-2(a), this shall delegate
14 powers to the Office.

15 (b) The objectives of the Office shall be—

16 (1) To conduct evaluations and investigations of
17 conflicts or disputes in the House;

18 (2) To provide oversight of the House and its
19 Agencies;

20 (3) Find and report weaknesses in programs and
21 operations within the House; and

22 (4) Receive and evaluate allegations of fraud,
23 waste, abuse, or mismanagement in House or
24 Agency programs and operations.

25 **SECTION 5. Funding.**

26 The House grants up to \$15,000 each fiscal year to the
27 Office for the purposes of completing its objectives.
