E IT ENACTED by this House of Commons, in this present, assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—	
SECTION 1. Title.	
This Act may be cited as "The Office of Inspector General Act".	
SECTION 2. Creation of Office.	
There is hereby established an Agency of the House to be known as "The Office of the Inspector General" (hereinafter referred to in this Act as the "Office").	
SECTION 3. Creation of Inspector General.	
There shall be at the head of the Office an Inspector General who shall be appointed by the Speaker, with the consent of the House.	
SECTION 4. Duties.	
(a) As provided in HCC $\S$ 10-3-2(a), this shall delegate powers to the Office.	
(b) The objectives of the Office shall be—
