**R E P O R T**

[To accompany H. Res. 11]

The Committee on Rules & Reform, having had under consideration House Resolution 11, by voice vote, report the same back to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

**SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION**

The resolution provides for consideration of H. Res. 10, expressing the need for proper oral care. All points of order against consideration and provisions in the resolution are waived. The previous question shall be considered as ordered. One hour of debate and one motion to recommit are in order.

In addition, the resolution provides for consideration of HR 3, the Tax Exemptions and Deductions Act (TEDA). Permits the Speaker to declare the House resolved into the Committee of the House Whole. The first reading of the bill dispensed with. All points of order against consideration are waived. General debate confined to the bill with one hour of debate. After debate, any amendment is in order under the five-minute rule. Amendments must be in writing. When the committee rises

and reports back to the House its recommendation to pass, the previous question shall be considered as ordered. One motion to recommit is in order.

Finally, the resolution permits the Speaker or Speaker pro tempore, to declare the House adjourned through February 28, 2023.
