[To accompany H. Res. 23]

The Committee on Rules & Reform, having had under consideration H Res 23, providing for consideration of HR 10, The Privacy Act of 2023, by voice vote, report the same to the House with the recommendation that the resolution be adopted.

SUMMARY OF PROVISIONS OF THE RESOLUTION

The resolution provides for consideration of HR 10, The Privacy Act of 2023, under a structured rule. The resolution permits the Speaker to declare the House resolved into the Committee of the Whole House for consideration of the bill. The first reading of the bill is dispensed with. All points of order against consideration of the bill are waived. General debate is confined to the bill and amendments specified in this report and shall not exceed one hour. Following general debate, the bill shall be under amendment under the five-minute rule. The bill, as amended by the Committee on Natural Resources, shall be considered as the original bill for the purposes of further amendments. All points of order against provisions in the bill are waived. Provides that only amendments printed in Part B of this report are in order. Each amendment may only be offered by a Member designed in the report, shall be considered as read, shall not be subject to demand for division of the

question in either the House or Committee of the Whole House. All points of order against further consideration are waived. At the conclusion of amendment consideration, the Committee shall rise and report the bill to the House with such further amendments as may have been adopted. The previous question shall be considered as ordered on the bill and on any further amendments thereto to final passage. Provides one motion to recommit.

EXPLANATION OF WAIVERS

Although the rule waives points of order against consideration of HR 10, the Committee is not aware of any points of order. The waiver is prophylactic in nature.

SUMMARY OF AMENDMENTS TO HR 10 IN PART B MADE IN ORDER

1. Leo: Add a section to the Act in regards to claiming birthday rewards. (10 minutes)
2. Leo: Provides for a grammatical clarification. (10 minutes)
3. Leo: Add a section to the Act to allow persons that have had their firearm license revoked to appeal the decision. Provides exemption to those that possess a firearm on House property solely to product domesticated animals from animals that pose an immediate threat. (10 minutes)

4. Leo: Permits DOR to pay Leo Cavinder \$36.65 for the costs incurred from updating the filters on clerk.commonsgov.org. (10 minutes
